BRIEF HISTORY

1. In 2004, Lt Gen Hari Prasad PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, VSM, ADC GOC -in- C Northern Command conceived and embarked on the noble mission of establishing Army Goodwill Public School, Rajouri. The aim being to provide quality education to the children of the union territory of Jammu and Kashmir. The Hon'ble Chief Minister Mr. Mufti Mohd Sayeed also contributed in the project in terms of land and infrastructure for water supply and electricity.

2. An 8.9 crore school project was planned under Op SADBHAVNA under the aegis of 25 Inf Div with laying of the foundation on 22 Aug 2004.

3. The project has been deliberately planned & executed in a period of three years and will remain as a land mark of sincere commitment of the Army to ensure well-being of the people and future generation of Jammu and Kashmir.

4. The school was formally inaugurated in September 2007 with first academic session from Apr 07.

LOCATION

5. The School is constructed on the hill, located 3.5 km from the town Rajouri, about 150 km from Jammu

at an altitude of 3500 ft. Though a modest hill station, it is resplendent with scenic beauty. In winters, the sight becomes breath taking with snow bound hills all around the town. Perched atop a hill, the Army Goodwill Public School with its colorful campus gives it an exclusive and imposing look. The nearest railway station Jammu is 150 km away.

THE ESTATE

6. The school campus covers an area of 300 kanals with security fencing all around. The main academic and administration buildings are centrally located with all other facilities, within walking distance. There are 20 class rooms designed to accommodate 35 students each. There is a separate block established for laboratories, library, gymnasium and arts and music. The residential wing has separate block for 150 boys and 50 girls, with comfortable dormitories. The hostel has kitchen equipped with all modern cooking facilities, located next to the hostels.

MISSION AND OBJECTIVES

7. The Army Goodwill Public school has been established for class VI to XII with a mission to provide modern and progressive educational facilities at a reasonable cost to the children of J&K.

The objectives laid down are:-

- a) To provide opportunity to each and every student to achieve academic and social excellence.
- b) To guide and mould children to develop physically and intellectually into a confident and responsible citizen of the country.
- c) To prepare them for all India Secondary School Examination (Class X) and the All Indian Senior School Certificate Examination (Class XII) conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

VISION

8. Virtues of basic communication skills, scientific transformed education and equipped with technological knowledge and utility is what our school is looking forward to achieve by the year 2024.

Army Goodwill Public School is and will be the school of choice to develop successful students to excel academically and in ethical leadership, cultural competence and community engagement.

9. The school Motto "Truth is God" befits the spirit and objectives of the school. The institute is functioning in 'Pursuit of Excellence'.

ACADEMICS

11. The school is affiliated with CBSE, New Delhi. AGPS offers two main streams, i.e. Science and Humanities as the course of study in Sr. Secondary classes. The subjects in class VI to X are as per CBSE syllabus, besides classes for Music, Arts & Crafts and Computer Education.

COMPUTER SECTION

12. The School has a state-of-art, well equipped Computer Lab. Computer Science is compulsory from class VI to class X. It is also offered as an elective subject at 10+2 stage.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

13. The school provides opportunity to all the students to participate in co-curricular activities like Art & Craft, Photography and Music to instill confidence, highlight talent and enhance public speaking skills. The pre-factorial system is an essential feature of the school. Senior students with appropriate leadership qualities are invested with the responsibility of prefects. This is an honor and at the same time a means for inculcating caring attitude, responsibility and initiative. The important co-curricular activities being planned are organized e.g visit to historical places, dance classes and various club activities and horse riding.

HEALTH

14. The school medical room functions within the campus where basic medical aid is provided. Any further treatment will be carried out at Govt Hospital Rajouri. The students admitted to the hospital will be charged as per hospital bill and the amount will be debited from the student's account.

15. Regular medical examination of the students will be carried out every term by a Medical Officer.

TRANSPORT

16. The school has its own fleet of buses and provides transport facility for the conveyance of its students from in and around the Rajouri town.

Parents are requested to study the specified routes and opt for those which suits them as per comprehensive details given in the transport form. Remember, it is not possible to cater to individual requirements at the cost of time and distance. No change of route, pickup point, door to door service and extension of route will be entertained and decision of school management committee will be deemed final. No representation will be accepted once you start availing school transport facility.

PRINCIPAL AND STAFF

17. In keeping with the national character, the school staff has been recruited from all over India. The staff is fully trained, experienced, motivated and dedicated to the cause. A highly experienced caterer is incharge of the students' Dining Hall, cooking and serving.

25. Provisional admission to class XI is granted immediately after the Board Examination of class X in one of the streams namely Science and Humanities. The admission is provisional and subject to passing the Board Examination of Class X, failing which the admission shall stand cancelled.

26. Parents seeking admission for their children are required to complete the application for registration on the form attached with the prospectus and forward it to the Principal along with registration fee as indicated, last date being 05 March.

AGE REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

27 (a) On 30th Sept of the year in which admission is sought, the minimum age of student should be:-

- Class VI : 10 yrs.
- Class VII : 11 yrs.
- Class VIII : 12 yrs.
- Class IX : 13 yrs.
- Class X : 14 yrs.
- Class XI : 15 yrs.

27 (b) For Classes X and XII the admission would be at the school Management's discretion that too under special transfer cases.

PAYMENT OF FEES

28. Fees are charged for full year irrespective of the date of admission/

withdrawal in the term. Under no circumstances shall the fee be adjusted or refunded.

29. Fees as indicated can be paid either using EazyPay Educational Parent Portal Mobile App or through POS Machine available at school.

No cash will be accepted in school office, Fee will be paid in lump sum by last day of Feb. The late fee @ Rs.20/- per day will be charged for delayed payment. Students will not be allowed to appear for the Annual/Board Examination in case the fee is not paid by 31st Jan.

WITHDRAWAL

30. In order to disenrol a child from school, parent must give the Principal at least three months' notice in writing preferably by Registered Post. In case acknowledgment is not promptly received, the notice should be sent again. The parents are requested to ensure that the notice of disenrollment is sent before the commencement of the next session i.e. by 31st Dec, failing which an amount of Rs, 300/- will be deducted. No verbal notice by anyone regarding withdrawal of a student will be binding on the school. No refund of fee is permissible in case of mid-term withdrawal.

ADMISSION RULES AND PROCEDURES.

All admissions of students into any class/grade of this school (ARMY GOODWILL PUBLIC SCHOOL RAJOURI, J&K) are governed by the following admission procedures.

1. The admissions will be confirmed only after the approval of the BOARD OF ADMISSION OF THE SCHOOL DEPUTED BY THE PRINCIPAL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SCHOOL.
2. The admission board, in general, follows an admission procedure which may be either a written test or an interview or merit list of previous class/grade or a combination of all these or some of these.
3. Students seeking admission into a particular class / grade of this school must have to appear before the ADMISSION BOARD OF THIS SCHOOL THROUGH THE PRESCRIBED ADMISSION PROCEDURES EITHER IN OFFLINE OR ONLINE MODE and the students who are qualifying the admission board procedures will be called for PROVISIONAL ADMISSIONS FIRST with the following TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS -

- a) Any additional facility sought by the selected students is subject to the conditions of the availability of that facility or resource with the management/ school and on the resource management capacity of the school .
- b) All additional facilities provided to the selected students are on ' first come - first serve' basis due to the reason of limited resources and limited availability of facilities.
- c) Parents are requested to study the specified routes and opt for those which suits them as per comprehensive details given in the transport form. remember that it is not possible to cater to individual requirements at the cost of time and distance. No change of route, pickup point, door to door service and extension of route will be entertained and decision of School management committee will be deemed final. No representation will be accepted once you start availing school transport facility.
- d) Admission of a selected student (on merit by the selection board procedure) into a particular class of this school will be confirmed only after the submission of
 - I) necessary documents(as per CBSE requirements) by the student/ parent &
 - II) prescribed fees as decided by the management of this school by the student / parent.
